

What is the New Outlook?

- New desktop email client for Windows with latest features, Microsoft Copilotassisted capabilities, and a new *modern and simplified design*.
- Same codebase as Outlook Web App with extended set of features and significant *feature parity* with classic Outlook for Windows Desktop.
- Included for free with Windows, replacing Windows Mail and Calendar apps.
- Allows you to access multiple inboxes and calendars in one app. Switch between *various email accounts*, including Office 365, Outlook.com, Gmail, Yahoo!, iCloud, etc.

Key Features Highlights



Multiple Accounts and Al

- Streamlined email & calendar in one app
 - \cdot Add accounts and see all calendars in one view
 - \cdot Toggle between accounts to see emails and contacts
- Write better emails with AI
 - Advanced AI writing tools provide suggested refinements for clarity, conciseness, inclusive language and more

Intelligent tools to keep you organized

- My Day view
 - \cdot See upcoming calendar events and tasks anywhere in Outlook
- Pin emails to the top of your inbox
- Snooze emails to temporarily hide them and then have them reappear when you're ready to respond
- Get reminders to follow up on important conversations
- Access and attach OneDrive files right from your inbox

Advanced Email Handling

- Schedule emails to be sent and delivered at the best time for the recipient
- Undo a sent email within ten seconds
- Use sweep function to clean up your inbox quickly
 - \cdot Works by setting advanced inbox rules for incoming emails

Customize your inbox

- Choose from over 50 themes and 150+ fonts
- Customize your view with roomy, cozy, and compact options
- Highlight important emails in Inbox using colors
 - \cdot Similar to Classic Outlook
 - \cdot Email sent directly To you or CC you
 - \cdot From certain people
 - \cdot With specific words in the subject

Security

- End-to-end message encryption for Microsoft email accounts
- S/MIME support
- Spam and malware filtering
- Data Loss Prevention and more...

 - \cdot In-person events, and more

Summarize email attachments with Copilot You will now be able to summarize PDF, Word, and PowerPoint email attachments with Copilot	April 2025

Shared Mailboxes as Accounts Shared Mailboxes can be added as Accounts in the new Outlook for Windows. The Shared Mailbox will appear at the Account Level in the Folder list.	June 2025
Online archive for shared mailboxes Online archive mailboxes will appear in the folder pane alongside other accounts, making it easier to access archived content for shared mailboxes.	April 2025

Open Attachments while offline You will now be able to open and save attachments from your email without an internet connection.	March 2025
Mail Merge (Advanced) When Mail Merge (Advanced) is launched, not only will every recipient receive their own email with only their email address in the recipients list, but the emails can further be personalized to include content such as their name.	April 2025

People Features

Feature	Rollout Start
People Hub Improvements People Hub offers a streamlined contacts interface with a single view of each person, automatically linking duplicates and enriching them with organizational profiles.	April 2025
"External" tag in contact suggestions An "External" tag will be added to contact suggestions that appear in the dropdown when entering contacts in the email compose form.	April 2025

Some other Mail and Calendar Updates

Feature	Rollout Start
 New RSVP settings Two new settings to improve the user experience when responding to meeting invitations: 1. Do not delete invitation email after RSVPing 2. Auto-decline if the attendee's calendar shows as busy 	March 2025
Reply To header Users will be able to toggle a "Reply to" field in the email compose form, which will allow them to add one or multiple addresses which will be used as the recipients for any replies to that message.	April 2025
